



Egypt's Economic *Profile and Statistics* is an annual booklet containing summary data and information about the various aspects of the Egyptian economy. Designed in a graphical and tabular format, this publication is intended mainly for the business community and investors seeking convenient information about the main developments in the Egyptian economy. This edition covers the fiscal year 2014/2015.¹

MAIN DEVELOPMENTS IN EGYPT DURING 2015*

15 January 2015	The Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) at the CBE decides to cut its main policy rates by $50\ \text{basis}.$

12 March 2015	Issuance of New Investment Law No.17/2015 and the Civil Service Law No. $18/2015$ by Presidential decree.
13-15 March 2015	Egypt's Economic Development Conference (EEDC) held at Sharm El Shiekh.
18 May 2015	Capital Gains Tax put on hold for two years.
1 Ju l y 2015	Second round of increases in electricity prices.
2-5 July 2015	The Egyptian pound depreciates in the official market by 2.6 percent against the US doll
5 August 2015	Egypt inaugurates Suez Canal expansion, which deepens 37km of the main waterway provides ships with a 35km (22 mile) parallel channel.
30 August 2015	Italian oil conglomerate Eni discovers a giant gas field in the Egyptian offshore, which is the largest found to date in the Mediterranean Sea.
12 September 2015	Appointment of Sherif Ismail as Prime Minister.
15-18 October 2015	The Egyptian pound depreciates in the official market by 2.6 percent against the US dollar
17 October 2015	Parliamentary elections were held in two phases lasting till December 2015.
21 October 2015	Tarek Amer is announced the new CBE governor by a Presidential decree.
November 2015	Russian airplane crashes over Sinai with negative repercussions for tourism.
10 November 2015	Egyptian national banks raise interest rates on savings certificates from 10 to 12.5 percent.
11 November 2015	The Egyptian pound appreciates in the official market by 2.5 percent against the US dollar.
13 November 2015	Standard and Poor's cut Egypt's credit rating from positive to stable on expectations that the country's external imbalances will persist as it may receive reduced financial
	support from the GCC countries.
19 November 2015	President Abdel Fattah el-Sisi witnessed the signing of a contract with Russia's Rosatom for the construction of Egypt's first nuclear power station at Al Dabaa.
26 November 2015	Formation of the new coordinating council of the CBE.
27 November 2015	The new CBE governor Tarek Amer starts his 4-year term.
7 December 2015	CBE adopts new definition for micro, small & medium enterprises, with an eye to improve access to finance.
17 December 2015	First meeting of the coordinating council of the CBE.
21 December 2015	CBE adopts new regulations for import transactions.
24 December 2015	The Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) at the CBE decided to raise its main policy rates by 50 basis points.
January 2016	The President announces the loan program for SMEs.
10 January 2016	The parliament of 596-members convened. Constitutional law professor Ali Abdel Aal was elected as speaker of the house.
11 January 2016	The CBE announces the guidelines to help finance SMEs.
21 January 2016	The Civil Service Law No. 18/2015 rejected by the Parliament among 342 presented laws
26 January 2016	CBE eases restrictions on monthly dollar cash deposits from USD 50,000 to USD 250,000 to four categories of importers.

Figure 2. Sources of Growth: Household consumption remains the main driver






Figure 3. Slight decline in unemployment



Figure 6. The pre-actual budget deficit shows a moderate decline in FY2014/15





Figure 8. Pubic debt: Increasing reliance on domestic borrowing






Figure 10. Domestic credit is increasingly being directed to the government



Figure 11. Sources of foreign currency: Workers' remittances continue to be a main source of foreign exchange






Figure 13. Steady net international reserves while the pound weakens


Figure 14. Policy rate increased by end-2015





Sectoral Distribution of Employment in 2013












National Road Network


Social Housing (The One Million Housing Unit Program)


